Monday April 8, 2019

2015 IRC/IBC Updates

CEU: 0.6 (Full Day)

The International Building Code® (IBC®) and International Residential Code (IRC) continues to establish minimum regulations for building systems using prescriptive and performance-related provisions. Reviewing and Inspecting for ADA Compliance

CEU: 0.3 (½ Day)

Every community is now struggling to ensure compliance with the Accessibility statues on existing buildings and new construction. This workshop will focus on what are the major items that you should be checking for during the plan review stages to ensure compliance is achieved. In addition, all phases of the inspection process will be reviewed to verify compliance with applicable standards and discuss common mistakes made at this stage.
